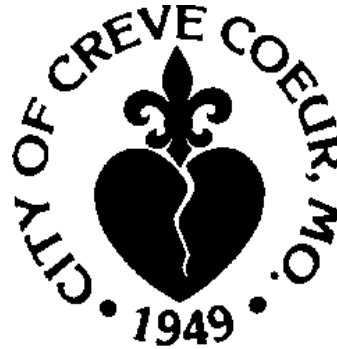
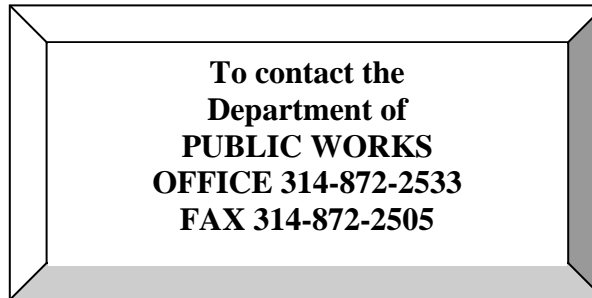


WHAT IS THE STREET TREE PROGRAM?

- ❖ The City of Creve Coeur Department of Public Works has earmarked \$10,000 for a 50/50-match program funding the installation of street trees along public streets in the City;
- ❖ The program is offered to residents with property adjacent to Public City rights-of-way;
- ❖ The City will fund ½ of the cost for the plant material and installation, on a first-come, first-serve basis;
- ❖ Residents select their tree from the list of available trees, pay their share of \$122.50 or \$217.50 per tree depending on size, and make payment in advance at the time of application;
- ❖ Once all requests have been processed, the City will plant all trees within a predetermined two-week period in November, weather permitting;
- ❖ Watering, trimming, and all other maintenance following the planting will be the responsibility of the homeowner.
- ❖ All new trees will be placed between the curb and the sidewalk. Properties without sidewalk frontage will place trees behind the edge of the pavement. All trees will be planted within the street right of way and not on private property.

HOW DO I PARTICIPATE IN THE STREET TREE PROGRAM?

STEP 1 Select the type of tree you would like to be placed along your property from the list of those available. Be mindful of overhead wires.

STEP 2 Deposit your share of the cost for the tree and installation with the City of Creve Coeur.

STEP 3 Place the stake, provided by the City, marking the location of where you would like your tree to be planted.

STEP 4 The City will verify the location you have selected for compliance with street tree planting guidelines and potential utility or traffic conflicts.

STEP 5 Trees will be installed by the City's contractor once all applications have been received and processed.

STEP 6 Enjoy the many benefits of your new tree.

Street trees may include any of the following species:

SMALL:

- 1) Snowdrift Flowering Crab
height: 15' to 20'
- 2) Native Redbud
height: 15' to 30'
- 3) Star Magnolia
height: 15' to 20'

MEDIUM:

- 4) Silver Linden
height: 50' to 70'
- 5) Hophornbeam
height: 25' to 40'
- 6) Flowering Dogwood
height: 15' to 25'

LARGE:

- 7) American Beech
height: 50' to 70'
- 8) London Planetree
height: 60' to 90'
- 9) Chinese Elm
height: 40' to 50'

The City may approve street trees not included in this list if the proposed tree is a deciduous hardwood, is disease resistant, is salt tolerant, and has a clear height of at least seven (7) feet six (6) inches.

General Tree Information

At the time of planting your tree will:

- ❖ Be approximately 1 to 1.5" or 2.5 to 3" in caliper based on your application
- ❖ Be approximately eight (8) feet in height
- ❖ Be fertilized
- ❖ Have mulch placed at the base of the trunk

General Planting Location Guidelines

When selecting the location of your tree, keep the following in mind:

- ❖ Must be within the right of way of a City street
- ❖ Must be a minimum of two (2) feet from the edge of pavement
- ❖ Must be a minimum of twenty five (25) feet from light or utility poles
- ❖ Be mindful of overhead wires
- ❖ Must be a minimum of ten (10) feet from manhole and inlet structures
- ❖ Cannot be in sight distance triangle, or in right of way adjacent to sight distance triangle, as shown below
